



ECONOMIC FORECAST, OCTOBER 5, 2017

ALSO, TO EXPLAIN THE SEARCH PROCESS AND CONFIDENTIALITY, CONFIRM THE SCHEDULE OF MEETINGS, DISCUSS PREFERRED ATTRIBUTES OF THE NEXT PRESIDENT, REVIEW THE DESCRIPTIONS AND NEEDS OF THE CAMPUS PRESIDENTIAL POSITION, AND DISCUSS ANY OTHER BUSINESS RELATED TO THE SEARCH PROCESS.

ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT INSIDE AND OUT, NOVEMBER 15, 2017




